THE WAY FORWARD

The United Methodist Church will be holding a special session of its General Conference (February 23-26) in order to decide how the denomination will approach LGBT inclusiveness in the church, especially with regards to ordination and marriage. There are three proposals: 1) The Traditionalist Plan would affirm and strengthen the current language of United Methodist Church Law (The Book of Discipline) that the LGBT lifestyle is incompatible with Christian teaching; 2) The Connectional Conference Plan: would create three 'connectional conferences' (mini-UMC denominations) each of the three would have a different position on LGBT inclusiveness (describable loosely as: conservative, centrist, and progressive). Local churches would choose to align with one of the three 'connectional conferences'; 3) The One Church Plan would maintain the current denominational structure but give each and every local church flexibility to decide for themselves how they will approach LGBT inclusiveness. The Council of Bishops of the United Methodist Church has endorsed the One Church Plan but it is the General Conference that will decide by vote at the end of February. **For members and friends of St. Andrew UMC who are concerned or interested in the decision, Pastor Erik will be hosting an open discussion, Q&A, and prayer gathering on Thursday February 28th at 7pm in the Sanctuary.**

FEBRUARY MISSION PRAYER Our Mission prayer focus for February is the Neighborhood Center in Camden, NJ. We pray for God's blessing upon the people who are served by the Neighborhood Center, from the youngest child in day care to the senior adults who participate in the Sage Program. Please also lift up in prayer those who work on staff and those who volunteer at the Neighborhood Center, that God would bless their work and efforts and enlarge their capacity to love abundantly, proclaiming Christ's love through their service.

THE NEIGHBORHOOD CENTER, INC. Begun in 1913 by UM Deaconesses, the Neighborhood Center in Camden is a United Methodist Women National Mission Institution. The mission of The Neighborhood Center is to generously love our neighbor as ourselves with abundant service and hope today and every day. The Neighborhood Center identified the need to break the cycle of poverty for children (which include poor education and poor family structures). Breaking the Cycle of Poverty, so that a child has success in life. The programs serving children are designed to help children and young adults in a 4-fold life: mind, body, spirit, and community. The Neighborhood Center drives sustainable programs that help a child to aspire; to achieve; and to be successful in school - and, along the way, learn about Christ. The Neighborhood Center demonstrates core Christian values - Love the Lord - through programs with children and the community. Programs include: Urban Community Farm; Child Care Learning Center; After School and Teens; Sophisticated Sisters; Camp Kumbaya (Summer Enrichment Program); Sages Program; and the Community Kitchen, daily serving a healthy, bagged take-away lunch to all who come. Information about these programs is available from The Neighborhood Center Facebook page and website.

We often think of the Child Care programs and After School programs at the Neighborhood Center. Did you know that the **Teens Program** at The Neighborhood Center is full and very active? With a program director, a male counselor and a female counselor, the teens meet every Tuesday evening for fellowship; opportunities to hear guest speakers who talk on such subjects as career planning and information about applying to college; special events like tours of colleges in the area like Rutgers; and, Open Mic nights once a month when the teens are able to express themselves through singing, poetry, etc. The teens are also offered the opportunity during the summer to work at the Urban Garden on site where they learn about Community Garden food production and mentor the younger children who attend the Summer Enrichment Program known as Camp Kumbaya. The Spirit Lake Ministry Center is dedicated to supporting the peoples of the Spirit Lake Nation and is an approved United Methodist Volunteer in Mission destination.

SPIRIT LAKE MINISTRY OUTREACH PROJECT

This project is a special outreach to Native American children through a program sponsored by the Spirit Lake Ministry Center in North Dakota (an approved United Methodist Volunteer in Mission destination). In 2018 we gathered

donations and arranged them as gift-filled boxes for 22 individual children. These gift-filled boxes were mailed to the Spirit Lake Ministry Center in ND and were distributed as part of their Christmas outreach program reaching children who live on reservations in ND, SD, and Minnesota. **During January and February, we are collecting donations for Christmas 2019 (new items only, please!): winter hats, mittens and gloves; bars of mild soap; soft toothbrushes; toothpaste (expiration date in 2020); small toys, crayons, and small coloring books or writing pads. The age groups include: 3-5; 6-8; 9-12; 13 and older.** Items may be placed in the marked bin in Fellowship Hall Lobby.
