Donations of food may be dropped off at the Food Pantry located next to Memorial Hall Kitchen or they may be placed in the receptacle in Fellowship Hall Lobby. Financial donations may be

given at any time; special offering envelopes are located at the Missions Table in Fellowship Hall Lobby.
